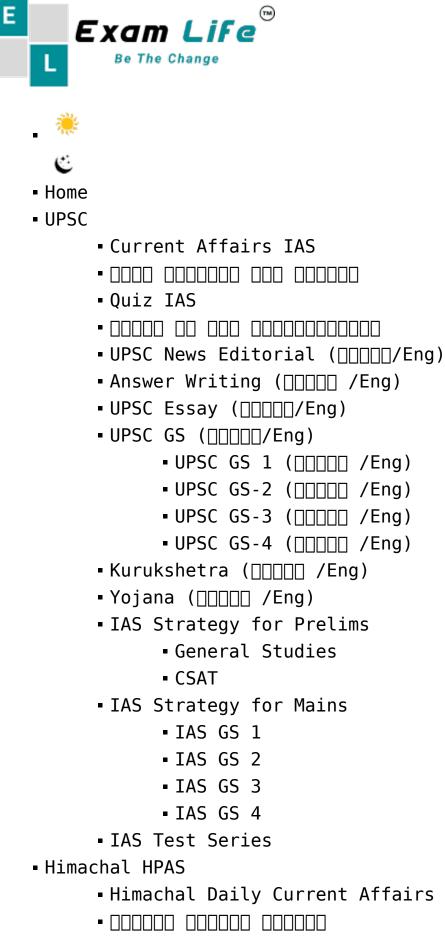

Let's understand the process :

Key Players and Timeline:

- The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) is very important and starts planning for the event about six months in advance.
- Prime Minister and President: Give their approval to the final choice made by the MEA.
- Indian Ambassadors: Discreetly ascertain the availability of potential invitees in their respective countries.

Factors that affect the decision:

- Politics: Making current relationships stronger, creating new partnerships, and dealing with global issues are very important.
- Economic interests: It is important to increase trade, investment, and collaboration in technology.
- Talking about working together with other countries in the military: We can focus on the partnerships we have and show how strong our military is.
- One important factor in making decisions is considering global problems, such as climate change and terrorism.
- One more thing that has been important in choosing the Chief Guest is their connection to the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM), which started in the late 1950s and early 1960s. The NAM was a group of countries that wanted to avoid getting involved in the conflicts of the Cold War. They also wanted to help each other as they built their own nations after gaining independence. The first important person at the parade in 1950 was President Sukarno from Indonesia. He was one of the five people who started the NAM.

The Process of Choosing:

• Shortlisting: The MEA, in consultation with other

stakeholders, identifies potential candidates based on the aforementioned objectives and considerations.

- **Prime Minister's Nod:** The MEA presents the shortlist to the Prime Minister for approval.
- Presidential Acclaim: Once approved by the PM, the list reaches the President's desk for final authorization.
- Discreet Confirmation: Through diplomatic channels, the Indian ambassador to the chosen country delicately confirms the guest's availability and interest.
- Official Overture: Upon acceptance, formal invitations are extended, and meticulous planning for the visit begins.




